WHO MAY APPLY:

APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED ONLY FROM:

- All Sources (M-Day, Technician and AGR) who are E4 and above. Individuals whose rank exceeds the maximum grade for this position will be required to take a reduction in rank prior to accepting the position.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

(If you do not meet all of these requirements, your application packet will be rejected.)

MILITARY OCCUPATION SPECIALTY (MOS): 74D. If not currently MOS qualified, selected individual has one (1) year from date of selection to become qualified. Individual must meet the following: A physical demands rating of very heavy, a physical profile of 122221, normal color vision, a minimum score of 95 in aptitude area ST in tests administered prior to 2 January 2002 and a minimum score of 91 in aptitude area ST in tests administered on and after 2 January 2002. Individual selected for this position will be required to satisfy a stabilization period IAW current HRO guidance. Applications will be accepted from individuals who meet the prerequisites outlined in NGR 600-5, DA PAM 611-21 and AR 135-18. Required security clearance IAW appropriate regulation.

PROMOTION POTENTIAL: Maximum grade for this position is **Sergeant (E5)**.

CURRENT MILITARY GRADE REQUIREMENTS: E4 and above members can apply.

APPLICANTS MUST AT APPLICATION TIME:

1. Be able to pass the Standard Army Physical Fitness Test (APFT).
2. Be at least 18 years of age or not have reached your 55th birthday. Must not be receiving any military retired pay.
3. Be able to serve at least three years on active duty status prior to completing 18 years Active Federal Service and be able to serve three years on active duty prior to mandatory removal based on age or service.
4. Meet physical standards IAW Chapter 3, AR 40-501 (Retention Standards). Must meet height and weight standards of AR 600-9. Must be medically certified as drug free and test negative for HIV in accordance with AR 40-501 and AR 600-110. Females who are NOT currently members of the Army National Guard must not be pregnant in accordance with AR 40-501 and AR 600-110. Must have current MOS Medical Retention Board (MMRB) if required.
5. Not have been involuntarily released from AD or FTNGD including AGR status or resigned in lieu of adverse personnel action. If voluntarily released from the AGR program, one year must have elapsed since the date of the release.
6. Not have any unfavorable personnel actions pending (Flagged), IAW AR 600-8-2 and AR 135-18.
7. Must be a United States citizen to apply.

MISSOURI ARMY NATIONAL GUARD MEMBERSHIP IS REQUIRED

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: Performs NBC detection and sample collection at a WMD incident site (hot zone). Knows firefighting and hazardous materials handling procedures and requirements. Executes chain of custody procedures. Sets up and operates NBC equipment and toxic industrial chemical detection, identification, survey and sample collection equipment. Performs all operational tasks wearing each level of Personnel Protection Equipment. Crosses and marks contaminated areas. Employs hand-held NBC detection and identification equipment to detect NBC contamination and obtains samples for medical or scientific analysis. Rescues and delivers injured persons to the decontamination stations. Processes through decontamination sites. Knows and utilizes NBC antidote administration and safe patient extraction, crime scene/evidence preservation techniques, and participates in and monitors chain of custody (sample transfer) procedure. Understands hazards, wind direction and speed, safety precautions, types of tests to be performed and mission criteria. Uses National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) guide to recommend the appropriate respiratory protection for team members. Maintains team leader OSHA Technician Level certifications. Uses an execution checklist with code words to monitor survey team detection, identification, and sample collection in the hot zone or contaminated area. Performs as NBC Team Chief in his/her absence. Responds immediately to travel to an incident site within four hours of notification to neutralize or help reduce highly hazardous threats. Performs other duties as assigned.

Only Soldiers that are SQI R qualified will be promoted against WMD-CST TDA positions. Upon selection as the WMD-CST SGT, the selected soldier is expected to fill this duty position and serve a minimum tour of 36 months upon successful CSSC completion.

Must meet CST operational medical requirements and standards. This includes completing a Chapter 3 physical and an OSHA/NFPA physical before completion of the hiring process. Further, HAZMAT technician certification requires that each individual maintain the minimum medical standards noted throughout their duty assignment IAW NFPA 472 certification standards.

Must successfully complete the Civil Support Skills Course, CBRNE Response (CSSC), an 8-week primer course to be completed upon selection into this program. The proponent for the CSSC is the US Army Chemical School, Ft. Leonard Wood, MO.

Must complete all TY technical training by duty position as identified by the annual matrix published by NGB for CSTs. New hires must be trained to 100% of Core I requirements within six months, 100% of Core II within 12 months and 100% of Core III within 24 months IAW CST Technical Training Matrix in effect at time of hiring. Personnel must be MOS qualified within one year of assignment IAW T32 regulatory guidance.

Must maintain mandatory duty position and HAZMAT qualifications IAW MOS qualification standards and 29 CFR 1910.120.

Must possess a SECRET clearance.

Must possess a Government Travel Card due to extensive travel requirements of the position. If member is unable to obtain GTC or it has been revoked, member must provide proof that he/she can meet financial obligations for extended TDY.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

PULHES. Applicants with 3 or greater in PULHES must have a MOS Medical Retention Board IAW AR 600-60.

MANDATORY TRAINING. This position may require mandatory formal training for full time support (FTS) personnel. Check with your unit or AGR Management Office for training requirements. Failure to complete the NGB prescribed courses at the Professional Education Center (PEC) for FTS personnel within the first year of employment or reassignment may be cause for reassignment or termination.

NATIONAL GUARD MEMBERSHIP REQUIRED. This position requires active membership in a compatible skill in the Missouri Army National Guard. Applicants who are not currently a member in the Missouri Army National Guard must be eligible for immediate enlistment or appointment. Enlisted soldiers must have completed initial entry training. For enlistment/appointment information, contact 1-888-464-8273 (toll free). Applicants will not make plans to enter into or move within the Active Guard Reserve Program until AGR orders are in hand and formal notification is received.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLYING

INDIVIDUALS MUST SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

1. NGB Form 34-1 (Application for Active Guard Reserve (AGR) Position). ENSURE position announcement number and position title are completed. This form must be dated and signed.
2. Copy of DA Form 705 (Army Physical Fitness Test Score Card). The latest APFT must have been taken within the past 12 months.
3. Copy of DA Form 2-1 (Personnel Qualification Record).
4. Copy of most recent ASVAB scores.
5. Copy of your DA Form 3349 (Physical Profile) and MOS Medical Retention Board (MMRB) results (if applicable).
6. Copy of DA Form 5500-R (Body Fat Worksheet) if applicable.
7. Copy of MEDPROS printout.
8. Copies of the last three NCOERs or OERs. If you don't have three NCOERs/OERs, you MUST submit a statement by a member of your chain of command attesting to your character of service.
9. NGB Form 23 (Retirement Point Summary) and/or a Statement of Service. Also, include copies of all DD Form 214s and NGB Form 22s if applicable.
10. Memorandum from unit stating whether or not unfavorable actions or flags are pending.
11. If you have ever applied for, have ever received or are currently receiving disability compensation or have a disability rating, all documents from VA must be provided.
12. Proof of military education (Officers only).
13. A memorandum stating willingness to accept a reduction in rank is REQUIRED for individuals whose rank exceeds the maximum grade for this position.
14. Soldiers who have not satisfied the stabilization period of one year from date of promotion or reassignment for E5 and E6 and two years from date of promotion or reassignment for E7 through E9 must submit a memorandum from their full-time Administrative Officer approving an exception to the stabilization policy.

If you are unable to provide any of the documents above, a memorandum must be submitted explaining why that document is not available.

CAUTION: If your application packet does not provide all the information requested on the forms and documents listed above, you will lose consideration for the job. ONLY complete applications will be considered. Applicants are responsible for maintaining a copy of their applications.

COMPLETION OF APPLICATION: Applicants must type or print in legible dark ink and SIGN and DATE the NGB Form 34-1. Failure to sign and date this form will result in rejection of the application. Complete applications MUST be physically received in the Human Resources Office by close of business on the closing date of the vacancy announcement. Applications received after close of business on the closing date of the vacancy announcement will be rejected. A separate application is required for each vacancy announcement.
